

CARTRIDGE MOUNTING

Since this turntable does not come with a cartridge, provide one of your own choosing and attach it to the headshell as below. This turntable uses a cartridge which weighs between 3 and 8 g.

1. Remove the headshell from the tonearm Use a small screwdriver to rotate the anchoring screw in the direction indicated by the arrow to remove the headshell.



Connect the headshell leads to the cartridge The polarities of the leads are color-coded. Plui them into the correct terminal tips.

• Red: Right channel (R)


· Green: Right channel ground (RG)

• White: Left channel (L)

Blue: Left channel ground (LG)

Attach the cartridge to the headshell

Attach the screws, nuts and washers provided to the Cartridge. Keep the screw loose.




4. Adjust the mounting position of the cartridge

(1) Stylus position: As shown in the figure, the stylus and headshell dimension is 56 mm.

(2) Compensating for bending:

As shown in the figure, make the cartridge parallel to the headshell.



(Unacceptable mounting)



5. After having tightened up the screw, attach the headshell to the tonearm (following the procedure given in step 1 in reverse).



PANEL FACILITIES



1 START/STOP switch

Depress this switch when starting auto play or when stopping play. (For details, refer to page 7 or 8.)

(2) REPEAT switch

Set this switch for repeat play. (For details, refer to page 8.)

(3) DISC SIZE switch

Set this switch in accordance with the size of the record which is to be played.

[7" 17] (released position):

For 17 cm EPs

[12" 30] (depressed position):

For 30 cm LPs

4 Quartz lock indicator

This lights when the platter is rotating at exactly 33-1/3 or 45 revolutions per minute.

(5) SPEED switch

Set this switch in accordance with the speed of the record which is to be played.

[33] (depressed position):

For 33-1/3 rpm records

[45] (released position):

For 45 rpm records

6 Cartridge

Turn to page 2 and mount the cartridge.

(7) Headshell

(8) Tonearm

(9) ARM ELEVATION lever

Operate this lever when starting manual play or when temporarily suspending play. (For details, refer to page 8.)

10 ANTI-SKATE control

This is rotated when performing the anti-skating adjustment. (For details, refer to page 5.)

(1) Arm rest

This serves to hold and clamp the tonearm. When moving the tonearm, release the clamp. (For details, refer to page 5.)

(12) Tracking force adjustment weight

This is used when adjusting the tracking force. (For details, refer to page 5.)

- (13) Platter
- (14) Platter mounting shaft
- 15 Rubber mat

16 EP adapter

This is used when playing records without a "middle."

- 17 Cabinet
- 18 Dust cover

OPERATIONS BEFORE USE

(Before using your turntable, carry out the instructions in step 1 through step 4.)

STEP 1 Assembling the Turntable

1 Removing the dust cover

1. Open the dust cover as far as it will go.

Hold both sides of the dust cover and remove it from the cabinet by pulling it up.

NOTE:

Take care not to mark or scratch the dust cover which you have now removed.

2 Checking the accessories

The accessories are housed in the polystyrene cushions which are used to package the turntable proper.




EP adapter
This is used to play records without a "middle."



Tracking force adjustment weight
This is mounted onto the end of the tonearm.

3 Removing the transit screws

Using a Phillips head screwdriver, rotate the transit screws (3) in the direction of the arrow in the figure and remove the platter and the platter cushions.




NOTE:

- The turntable will not operate unless these screws are removed.
- Keep the screws and cushions in a safe place since they are required when transporting the turntable from place to place.

4 Mouting the platter and rubber mat


1. Place the platter over the platter mounting shaft.

2. Place the rubber mat on top of the platter.



NOTE:


When mounting the platter, take care not to bump it into the platter mounting shaft, the cabinet and the tonearm.



Attaching the tracking force adjustment weight

 Insert the weight over the end of the weight shaft with the scale side turned in front.


 Push it a short way along the shaft and rotate the weight part (indicated as [in figure) in the direction indicated by the arrow for two or three turns.



6 Mounting the dust cover

 Hold both sides of the dust cover and slide the hinges into the cabinet's hinge holders.

2. Push down until the dust cover goes no further.



STEP 2 Adjusting the Tracking Force and Anti-Skating

1 Setting the ANTI-SKATE control to [0]

Rotate the control in the direction indicated by the arrow and align [0] with the index line.



2 Setting the ARM ELEVATION lever to

Pull down the lever toward you.

3 Removing the stylus cover

A Releasing the arm rest.

Move the arm rest in the direction

Move the arm rest in the direction of the arrow by hand.

NOTE:


Hold the tonearm with your other hand since it may move.

5 Moving the tonearm

Move the tonearm to between the arm rest and platter.

6 Attaining the horizontal balance (make the tonearm parallel)


As shown in the figure, rotate the weight part (indicated as [in figure) of the tracking force adjustment weight in the direction indicated by the arrow and adjust it so that the tonearm remains parallel to the cabinet when it is released.




7 Anchoring the tonearm to the arm rest

8 Setting the tracking force scale ring to [0]

Rotate only the tracking force scale ring (indicated as in figure) of the tracking force adjustment weight in either of the directions shown by the arrows and align [0] with the index line.





NOTE:

 Hold the weight part with your other hand to prevent it from rotating with the ring.

 Once the weight part has been rotated, attain the horizontal balance again as under section 6

9 Adjusting the tracking force

Rotate the weight part (indicated as [in figure) in the direction of the arrow (the tracking force scale ring will also rotate), and align the number which is the same as the cartridge's tracking force with the index line.

(If, for instance, the correct tracking force is 2 g, align the number "2" on the scale ring with the index line.)


Weight part


- •One scale unit on the tracking force scale ring is 0.1 g.
- A tracking force of 3g is applied with every turn of the weight.

10 Adjusting the anti-skating

Rotate the ANTI-SKATE control in the direction indicated by the arrow and align the number which is the same as the tracking force with the index line.

(If, for instance, a tracking force of 2 g has been applied, align the number "2" on the control with the index line.)





STEP 4 Installing the Turntable-

Take note of the following points and install the turntable properly. Find a location which:

- Is horizontal and flat.
- Is characterized by minimal floor vibration or is not affected by any vibrations transmitted.
- Is not affected by high sound pressures or vibrations from the speaker system.
- (Do not install the turntable immediately in front of, or on top of, the speakers.)
- Allows easy operation and gives visible access to the record and stylus.
- Is near to the stereo amplifier.
- (Install the turntable within a range where the connecting cords reach the terminals on the amplifier.)
- Is not directly exposed to direct sunlight or heat from heating appliances.
- (Do not install the turntable near a heater or on a window ledge exposed to the sun.)
- Is not exposed to dust and dirt.
- Is free from damp and moist air.

After having carried out steps [1] through [4], read through the following checkpoints.

Check the tracking force and anti-skating adjustments.

The ANTI-SKATE control must be aligned with the same number as the tracking force.

The following trouble is apparent when the number does not tally with the tracking force:

Too high: The sound is distorted and the tonearm slides toward the outside of the record.

Too low: The tonearm slides toward the inside of the record when the stylus descends onto the record.

The tracking force must be adjusted within the correct tracking force range of the cartridge.

The following trouble is apparent when the tracking force is not properly adjusted:

Excessive tracking force:

The sound is distorted and the cartridge itself touches the record.

Insufficient tracking force:

The sound is distorted and interrupted.

The tracking force must be adjusted with the ANTI-SKATE control at [0].

Unless this control is set to the [0] position, a force is generated by the anti-skating mechanism which pulls the tonearm to the right (toward the arm rest). Therefore, when attaining the horizontal balance, the tonearm is not at rest and so the operation is difficult to perform.

Even at the [0] position there may be some movement. This is due to the increased rotational sensitivity of the tonearm enabling the stylus to trace efficiently the sound grooves on the record, and it does not indicate that there is anything wrong with the turntable.

Check the installation and connections of the turntable

The turntable must be connected to the input PHONO terminals of the amplifier in line with the type of cartridge which is being used.

When using an MM cartridge:

Connect to the amplifier's PHONO MM terminals.

When using a low-output MC cartridge:

Connect to the amplifier's PHONO MC terminals if these are available. If they are not available, use an MC cartridge transformer or a head amplifier. (For details, refer to the Operating Instructions of the cartridge or the amplifier.)

• Incorrect connections of installation will lead to trouble

If the equipment is connected improperly, no sound will be heard. If the output cord plugs are not inserted as far as they will go or if the ground wire is not connected, humming noise will be heard through the speakers.

If the turntable is installed at an angle, the tonearm will slide on the record and the sound will be distorted. If vibrations are transmitted to the turntable, the sound may be discontinuous or it may tremble, and in some cases how! (a prolonged wailing sound from the speakers) may be heard.


The connecting cords should be given some slack

Check that none of the connecting cords are pulled taut after they have been connected. Tautness may lead to cord disconnections and howl.

RECORD PLAY

When Using the Turntable for the First Time-

The turntable may operate unstably due to the vibrations sustained during transportation. Proceed as follows to restore the turntable to its normal working operation. This procedure is observed only once; on other occasions it may be disregarded.





- 1 Set the ARM ELEVATION lever to the UP position.
 - 2 Release the arm rest.
- 3 Move the tonearm by hand.
- The platter starts to rotate.
- Release the tonearm after having moved it.
- 4 Depress the START/STOP switch.

Several seconds after the switch has been depressed, the tonearm returns automatically to the arm rest and the platter stops rotating.

Record Play Procedure

(Auto Play)





1 Set the stereo amplifier up for record play.

Set the amplifier's power switch to ON and set the function selector to the PHONO position.

- 2 Place the record onto the platter.
- 3 Remove the stylus cover
- 4 Release the arm rest
- Depress the SPEED switch and set the speed:


Depressed position for playing 33-1/3 rpm records Released position for playing 45 rpm records

6 Depress the DISC SIZE switch and set the size of the record:

Released position for playing 7" 17 cm records Depressed position for playing 12" 30 cm records


- 7 Set the ARM ELEVATION lever to the DOWN position
- B Depress the START/ STOP switch to start record play

Several seconds after this switch has been depressed, the platter starts to rotate and the tonearm automatically moves across to the record. Record play begins.




- Adjust the volume and tone using the controls on the stereo amplifier
- 10 Record play ends

The tonearm automatically returns to the arm rest and the platter stops rotating.



Repeat Play-

Observe the instructions in steps 1 through 6 on the page 7 and then proceed as follows.



How to release repeat play


Depress the REPEAT switch again. Upon completion of record play, the tonearm automatically returns to the arm rest and the platter stops rotating.

1 Release the REPEAT switch

Set the switch to the released position (...).

- 2 Set the ARM ELEVATION lever to the DOWN position
- 3 Depress the START/STOP switch to start record play
- Adjust the volume and tone using the controls on the stereo amplifier
- 5 Record play ends. Play is repeated


Upon completion of record play, the tonearm automatically returns to the first track and play is repeated. This operation continues until the repeat play function is released.




Manual Play----

Proceed with manual play in the following circumstances:

- When starting play at any track except the first.
- When the size of the record is not standard which makes auto play impossible.



Set the ARM ELEVATION lever to the UP position



Position the tonearm over the spot on the record where play is to begin and then release the headshell.

- The platter starts to rotate.
- The stylus remains floating above the record and so no sound is heard yet.

3 Set the ARM ELEVATION lever to the DOWN position

The stylus now descends onto the record and play begins.

Adjust the volume and tone using the controls on the stereo amplifier (Upon completion of record play, the tonearm returns automatically to the arm rest.)

Temporarily Suspending Play-

This can be done in two ways

Depress the START/STOP switch

Several seconds after this switch is set, the tonearm automatically returns to the arm rest and the platter stops rotating.

NOTE:

If the REPEAT switch is set to the release position, auto play begins again after the tonearm has returned to the arm rest.

Set the ARM ELEVATION lever to the UP position

The stylus rises from the surface of the record and play stops (but the platter continues rotating).

When the tonearm is returned manually to the arm rest, the platter stops rotating.

NOTE:

After the tonearm has been returned manually to the arm rest, always remember to set the ARM ELEVATION lever to the DOWN position.

Record play precautions

When the tonearm does not descend at the proper place on the record

When during auto play the tonearm does not move as far as the record or if it moves too far and play starts from a position further across the record, refer to "Adjusting the stylus descent position" on page 9 and adjust.

When the tonearm does not return automatically

If a record with a non-standard size is being played, the tonearm may not return even after play or it may return before the completion of play. In cases like this, depress the START/STOP switch and the record play is concluded automatically.

Clean the stylus and records before and after play (refer to page 10)

Dust or dirt on the stylus or records will result in distorted and discontinuous sound.


Remove the dust on the stylus with a soft brush. Use a good-quality record cleaner obtainable from your dealer to remove dust and dirt on your records.

Place only one record on the platter at a time

If two or more records are placed, the angle of the stylus on the record will deviate, resulting in distorted sound.

Adjusting the Stylus Descent Position

Proceed as follows when the stylus does not descend in the proper position on the record during auto play. While performing the adjustment, take care not to scratch the record with the stylus.



- 1 Place a 30 cm record on the platter.
- 2 Depress the STAR/STOP switch and start auto play.

Check the direction and amount of stylus deviation (how many millimeters toward the inside or outside of the record's lead-in groove).

- B Depress the START/STOP switch and return the tonearm to the arm rest.
- After the platter has stopped rotating, check the screw in the adjustment hole.
- 5 Rotate the screw with a small screwdriver in accordance to the direction of the deviation observed in step 2.
 - Every semi-turn of the screw corrects the stylus descent position by about 18 mm.
 - Rotate the screw clockwise if the stylus descends on the outside of the proper position.
 - Rotate the screw counerclockwise if the stylus descends on the inside of the proper position.
- 6 Depress the START/STOP switch and check that the adjustment has been performed properly.

Repeats steps 3 through 6 if the stylus still deviates.

MAINTENANCE

Maintaining the turntable

When the cabinet is dirty or dusty

Use a polishing cloth or a dry soft cloth to clean off the dirt and dust.

When the cabinet is stained

Dip a soft cloth into neutral detergent diluted with five or six times the amount of water, wring the cloth out and clean off the stains. Next, wipe off all the remaining moisture with a dry soft cloth.

Do not use chemicals or furniture wax

Never use furniture wax, cleaners, thinners or benzene for cleaning since these will mar and discolor the surface finish of the cabinet.

Do not spray with insecticides

If insecticide sprays are allowed to come into contact with the surface of the cabinet, the surface may be discolored and the finish spoiled.

Maintaining the stylus

Use a soft brush

As shown in the figure, move the brush toward you to clear off the dust and dirt. Do not use your finger since this will damage the stylus.



When the dirt cannot be removed by a brush

Obtain some stylus cleaner from your dealer and remove. Do not allow any of the liquid to come into contact with the plastic parts as they may dissolve.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Incorrect operations are often mistaken for trouble and malfunctions. If you think that there is something wrong with your turntable, check out the points below. Sometimes, the trouble may lie in another component. Investigate the stereo amplifier, speaker systems and other electrical apparatus which are being used.

If the trouble cannot be rectified even after exercising the checks listed below, ask your nearest PIONEER authorized service center or your dealer to carry out repair work.
